Mass at Jesus the Good Shepherd

The parish continues to follow relevant advice from NSW Health and the Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle. There is a continuing need to **remain vigilant** and **focused** on the safety and wellbeing of the community. The following information is provided so that parishioners and visitors may know what to expect while attending Mass and feel confident in doing so.

- ✓NSW Health still recommends 1.5m physical distancing be maintained.
- ✓ The wearing of **masks** in places of worship is not mandatory. Where maintaining physical distancing indoors is particularly challenging, wearing masks is encouraged by NSW health. For your convenience, masks are available at the church entrance.
- ✓ Hand sanitiser is recommended and provided.
- ✓ Bulletins are not handed out. Please pick up your own and take it home with you afterwards...... <u>DO NOT RETURN IT</u>.
- $\checkmark {\rm Holy \ Water}$ is now available and needs to be changed regularly.
- \checkmark Select your **seat** and allow 1.5m between families / households.
- $\checkmark {\rm Singing}$ is permissible within places of public worship. It is advisable to refrain from handing out **hymnals**.
- ✓ Parishes can now use liturgical ministers readers, servers, etc.
- ✓ Procession of Gifts may take place as directed by our Priest.
- ✓The Sign of Peace remains contactless except between those residing in the same household.
- \checkmark The distribution of **Communion** during Mass continues to present a high risk. In general, two (2) ministers (including the Priest) are adequate to distribute the Lord's Body. Please <u>maintain</u> <u>a single line</u>.
 - The **Communion host** can be received in the hand, and on the tongue with care. Since the latter is still deemed high risk, please proceed to the Priest only and at the end of the line.
 The **Precious Blood** is restricted to Priests only.
- ✓ The collection plate has resumed during Mass. Thank you for your continued support.
 - First Collection supports all our diocesan Priests.
- Second Collection supports our parish operating costs.
- $\checkmark\,{\rm Exit}$ whilst maintaining the 1.5 metres physical distancing.

Sacraments

The parish continues its commitment to providing a safe environment. The following information offers guidelines around Sacraments.

Anointing of the Sick: Masses with the Anointing of the Sick resume this year.

1514 The Anointing of the Sick "is not a sacrament for those only who are at the point of death. Hence, as soon as anyone of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived."

Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism can be celebrated: however, in the current circumstances Baptism can only be celebrated by the pouring of water and not by immersion. Baptism enquiries may be made via the Presbytery or Parish Office.

Baptism Preparation: The program is held every first Saturday of the month, <u>except January</u>, at 11:15AM in the Parish Hall at Belmont. Enrolment forms are available at each church or from the Parish Office. Our next meeting is on <u>Saturday 6 May 2023</u>. Bookings are essential.

Funerals: To organize a funeral please contact the Funeral Directors who will then contact the Parish Priest.

<u>Columbarium</u>: For an information handout contact the Parish Office.

Marriage: For all wedding enquiries or bookings, contact Fr Gerard.

Penance: The celebration of the Sacrament of Penance is available.

Penance Times:

- Belmont: Saturday morning after Mass
- Swansea: Saturday evening before Mass

This is 'Good Shepherd Sunday' and a particular focus taken today is leadership. Which voices do we follow? Why do we follow these voices and not others? Authentic leadership is rooted in authority, and authentic authority is the ability to author or bring life to birth. Genuine authority cherishes, guards and encourages the best in life; it provides rest and refreshment; it guides our steps; it nourishes us; it leads us to God. Peter is an example of authentic authority: he proclaims the truth, even if others find it hard to hear; he

denounces error, even when this places him in jeopardy; he calls for a change of heart, even when it makes great demands.

Authentic leadership is patterned after the leadership of Jesus. It is gentle and familiar, like the true shepherd; it has won the confidence of those who follow, as did the true shepherd; it is committed to the enhancement of the lives of others, as was Jesus. Authentic leadership is willing to forgo its own needs and to deny its own interests in favour of the needs and interests of others.

Heavy demands are placed on those who follow authentic leadership. Those who follow the Good Shepherd must follow him in the dark valleys as well as to the refreshing streams. They must be willing to relinquish some of their own plans and self-determination and entrust themselves to his leadership. First Reading Acts 2:14. 36-41

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

God has made Jesus both Lord and Christ.

On the day of Pentecost Peter stood up with the Eleven and addressed the crowd with a loud voice: 'The whole House of Israel can be certain that God has made this Jesus whom you crucified both Lord and Christ.'

Hearing this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and the apostles, 'What must we do, brothers?' 'You must repent,' Peter answered 'and every one of you must be baptised in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. The promise that was made is for you and your children, and for all those who are far away, for all those whom the Lord our God will call to himself.' He spoke to them for a long time using many arguments, and he urged them, 'Save yourselves from this perverse generation.' They were convinced by his arguments, and they accepted what he said and were baptised. That very day about three thousand were added to their number.

Second Reading 1 Pt 2:20-25

A reading from the first letter of St Peter

You had gone astray but now you have come back to the shepherd and guardian of your souls.

The merit, in the sight of God, is in bearing punishment patiently when you are punished after doing your duty.

This, in fact, is what you were called to do, because Christ suffered for you and left an example for you to follow the way he took. He had not done anything wrong, and there had been no perjury in his mouth. He was insulted and did not retaliate with insults; when he was tortured he made no threats but he put his trust in the righteous judge. He was bearing our faults in his own body on the cross, so that we might die to our faults and live for holiness; through his wounds you have been healed. You had gone astray like sheep but now you have come back to the shepherd and guardian of your souls.

Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia. I am the good shepherd, <u>says the Lord;</u> I know my sheep, and <u>mine know me</u>. Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia.

<u>Gospel</u>

Jn 10:1-10

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John *I* am the gate of the sheepfold.

Jesus said: 'I tell you most solemnly, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold through the gate, but gets in some other way is a thief and a brigand. The one who enters through the gate is the shepherd of the flock; the gatekeeper lets him in, the sheep hear his voice, one by one he calls his own sheep and leads them out. When he has brought out his flock, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow because they know his voice. They never follow a stranger but run away from him: they do not recognise the voice of strangers.'

Jesus told them this parable but they failed to understand what he meant by telling it to them.

So Jesus spoke to them again: 'I tell you most solemnly, I am the gate of the sheepfold. All others who have come are thieves and brigands; but the sheep took no notice of them. I am the gate. Anyone who enters through me will be safe: he will go freely in and out and be sure of finding pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I have come so that they may have life and have it to the full.'
