**NOVEMBER 2024** 

At their November 14, 2024 meeting Diocesan Liturgy Council members

- congratulated council secretary, Louise Gannon rsj, on her 29 November retirement from her diocesan liturgical role
- received formation on the process of developing and approving revised and new liturgical book: Green Books, then Grey Books then White when approved.
- accepted previous meeting minutes and report
- accessed new 2025 council planning calendar
- endorsed St Joseph Bakhita working party proposals and methodologies
- received local church updates on
  - o correspondence and communication since latest meeting
  - o suggestions for diocesan celebration of the Vatican Jubilee 2025 Year of Hope
  - o communication from Bishop Michael to parishes regarding Communion from the chalice, and the ministry of Christian Initiation
  - o continued formation being provided to Maitland Catholic Region, and ideas from that formation
  - o possible new Christian Initiation Forum members
  - o diocesan communal choir suggestions pending the success of recent Creation Sings
  - o need for future planning of significant marriage anniversary project, and EOY liturgical celebration
  - o planning meeting for 2025 Christian Formation Course liturgy unit work
- received national/international church updates on
  - o proposal for a Feast of Creation to be added to the liturgical calendar; formation resources for lectors/acolytes; aboriginal symbols in liturgy.
  - o official texts: release of Roman Missal supplement; progress on update to Order of Baptism of Children; project for work on the Grey Book for the revised Order of Christian Initiation of Adults
  - o Jubilee Year resources
  - o 2025 national conference dates and promotion AAL and NLC/APMN

The work of the Council extends beyond its meetings, particularly through its subgroups, and currently includes

- ongoing ministry of the College of Assistant Masters of Ceremonies
- supporting parishes, agencies and groups in the preparation of liturgies at which the Bishop or his delegate presides

- facilitating formation, including the Maitland Pastoral Region, Myall Coast, Singleton (Stepping Stones), City Region (Christian Initiation)
