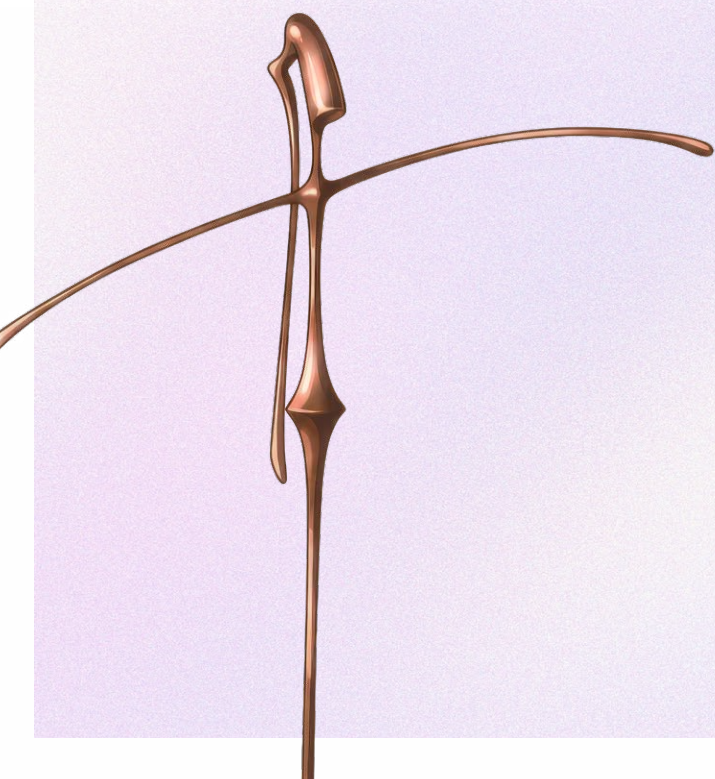
2026 Magdalene AWARDS

About the Magdalene Award

The Magdalene Award recognises a woman who embodies the courage, leadership, and faithfulness of Mary Magdalene—the first witness to the Risen Christ and known as “the apostle to the apostles”.

The Award affirms a woman living in and committed to the Catholic Diocese of Maitland–Newcastle whose life and service reflect Gospel values and the spirit of Mary Magdalene.

The 2026 Award recipient will receive the perpetual statue for the year, along with a spiritual nourishment opportunity (such as a retreat/ faith formation experience or bookshop voucher) to an agreed value. All nominees will receive a perpetual pin.



Eligibility Criteria

Nominees must:

- Be **aged 18 years or over**.
- Be an **active member of a Parish** in the Diocese of Maitland–Newcastle.
- Have made a **positive contribution** in decision making, leadership, and/or ministry within the Parish or Diocese in the last 2 years.
- Actively contribute in a **voluntary** capacity to Parish or Diocesan life.

Additionally:

- The benefit of the work done must be for the Maitland-Newcastle Diocesan community.
- Women may be nominated in multiple years.
- Diocesan employees are eligible only for their voluntary contribution, not paid work.

Background

In 2000, the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference established the Council for Australian Catholic Women. Following local consultation in 2014, the Council inaugurated the Magdalene Award in 2015 as an annual recognition of women’s contribution to Church life.

In 2020, Bishop Bill Wright commissioned the Diocesan Council for Women to continue fostering women’s participation and leadership across the Diocese.

After a four year pause due to COVID 19, Bishop Michael Kennedy endorsed the relaunched Award in 2024.

Key Dates and Presentation

- **Nominations close:** Monday 8 June 2026 (late submissions cannot be accepted).
- **Presentation:** Commencing with Mass at Sacred Heart Cathedral on Sunday 26 July 2026 at 9:30am, with Bishop Michael Kennedy presiding.
- **Invitations** will be sent to all nominees, nominators and referees to attend. Nominees may elect to invite their family and friends to attend.

How to nominate?

Any member of the Diocesan community may submit a nomination with the nominee's permission.

To nominate, you must:

- Complete the Nomination Form.
- Address each of the three Award Criteria which are strictly limited to 200 words per question.
- Obtain the Nominee's signed consent.
- Include the signed Image Release Form.
- Provide contact details for two referees, including:
 - A Parish Priest, Deacon or
 - A School Principal or Assistant Principal
- Ensure all referees have given permission to being contacted.

Tips for Nominating

- ▶ Address the Award Criteria directly and succinctly.
- ▶ Stay within the word limit (in fairness to all nominees, excessive responses beyond the word limit will not be read).

Review Process

A Magdalene Award Review Panel will assess all nominations. The Panel comprises:

- The Bishop or his delegate
- A Non-Voting Panel Coordinator
- Three independent representatives of the Diocesan Community.

About the Statue

Created in 2017 by local artist Will Maguire.

The statue is made from forged steel, mounted on a stable base of naturally worn stone from the local area.

It depicts a woman standing tall in a strong committed stance with caring arms spread forth, her long hair falling freely behind. The clear cross-like form of the body refers to Mary Magdalene's connection with the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus and the attributes which lead her to be in such a situation.

In essence the award aims to be a simple peaceful work that can be contemplated by the recipients in quite reflective moments. It is not intended to be fully understood or explained, like St. Mary Magdalene herself.

- 2. Describe a time within the past two years when the nominee demonstrated leadership and community engagement. (200 words maximum).**
(Outline the situation/need that arose, the actions taken to lead/organise/encourage, who benefited from the leadership and the positive change/results/outcome that followed.)
- 3. In what ways does the nominee currently minister within her Parish and/or diocesan community? (200 words maximum)**
(E.g. Formation, Liturgical, Sacramental, Pastoral, Mentoring, Accompaniment or Outreach Activities)
